Organization	Audience cannot understand presentation because there is no sequence of information.	Audience has difficulty following presentation because student jumps around. Subject Knowledge	Student does not have grasp of information; student cannot answer questions about subject. Delivery	Students provides no eye contact; mumbles; speaks too quietly; uses incorrect grammar frequently; relies on "filler" sounds; reads entire presentation directly from PowerPoint.	Student occasionally provides eye contact; uses low voice volume; uses incorrect grammar and "filler" sounds occasionally; frequently reads directly from PowerPoint.	Student maintains eye contact, but returns to notes frequently; voice is clear; rarely uses incorrect grammar and "filler" sounds.	Students maintains eye contact, rarely returns to notes; no incorrect grammar or "filler" sounds noticeable.		
Professionalism (see required attire below)	Student late for presentation; not dressed professionally. No evidence of preparation. No portfolio.
